Commentary on the year's results and financial outlook

In accordance with the diocesan accounting policy for parishes, the accounts present receipts and payments in the year ended 31st August 2025. Their timing can have a significant effect on the results in any year. The accounts consolidate transactions in the three parish bank accounts, but do <u>not</u> include transactions in Catholic Resource Centre Limited (CRC), which is registered for VAT and which manages the carpark and repository. A surplus in the first full year of CRC's new operations (year ended 31st August 2024) enabled CRC to pay a dividend of £69,396 to the parish in May 2025. The parish accounts do not include £11,000 received from the repayment of loans made to the diocese in 2023. The balance owing to the parish from the diocese at 31st August 2025 was £19,792.

Average Mass count increased by **21%** (autumn 2024 to autumn 2025) and the offertory collection for the year (before gift aid) increased by **18%**, mainly due to the installation of two new contactless DONA machines. The offertory (before gift aid) covered **55%** (23-24: 42%) of the total ordinary operating costs of the parish (i.e., excluding major repairs). The parish benefited from donations which had been made to the diocesan *Closer to Christ* campaign and from **legacies** totalling £98,805. Please do consider leaving a bequest to the cathedral in your will.

The parish also had a one-off receipt of £40,141 from the diocese relating to the diocese's share of insurance and utility costs for the whole cathedral site, which had been paid by the parish in previous financial years.

Donations received from other parishes as a result of an appeal for assistance totalled £14,500, a considerable decrease on the previous year's donations of £137,000. We need soon to launch a fundraising campaign to cover essential repairs required over the next few years to the cathedral roof, to the heating and electrical systems, as well as the possible underpinning of the subsiding west end. This work will cost about £2.5 million. Funds permitting, we also have ambitious plans for the interior of the cathedral and for improvements to the ancillary buildings on the site.

On 31st August 2025, the parish had a total of £126,657 in its current accounts and £355,061 on bank deposit. In total, this represents only 19% of the estimated £2.5 million needed over the next few years to complete essential repairs to the cathedral building.

Some statistics for the parish for the year:

- The ordinary cost of running the parish (excluding major repairs) was
 £722 per day or £5,067 per week.
- About 42% (2024: 46%) of the parish weekly collection was by planned giving (standing order, direct debit or envelope).
- The Sunday average Mass count (autumn 2025) was **1,141** (2024: 944).
- Allowing for one third of the Mass count to be children, the estimated average weekly donation per Sunday Mass adult attendee was £3.68 (2024: £3.79).
- Approx. **111** parishioners have gift aided their regular donation in the past year.

Ways in which you can support your parish:

- 1) Consider whether you can **increase** your donation to the parish.
- 2) Switch to giving by way of **standing order** or **direct debit**. This ensures that the parish receives a more regular source of income.
- 3) If you are a UK taxpayer, complete **a gift aid declaration**, which increases your donation by 25% **at no extra cost to you**.
- 4) Include a **bequest** to the cathedral parish in your **will**.
